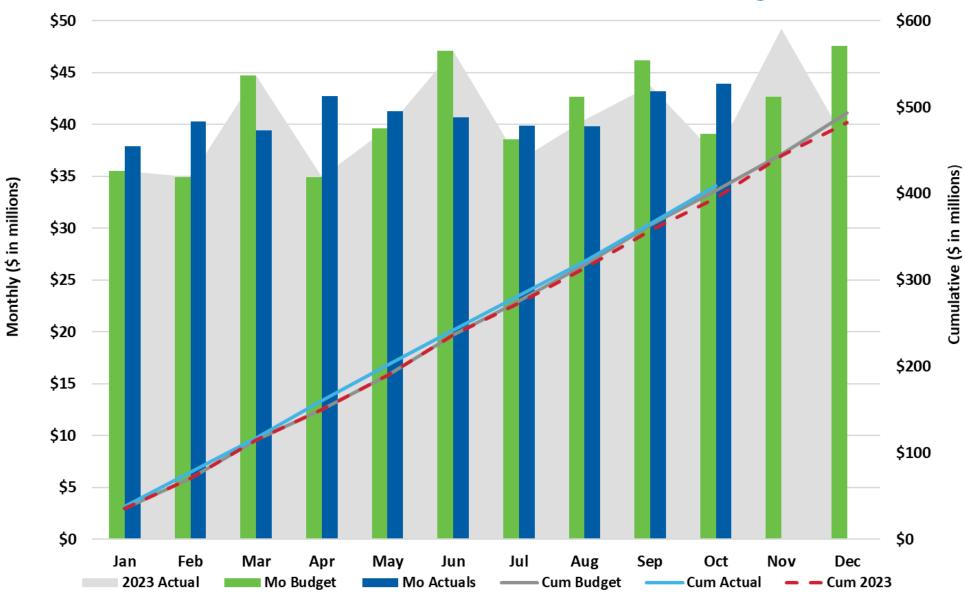

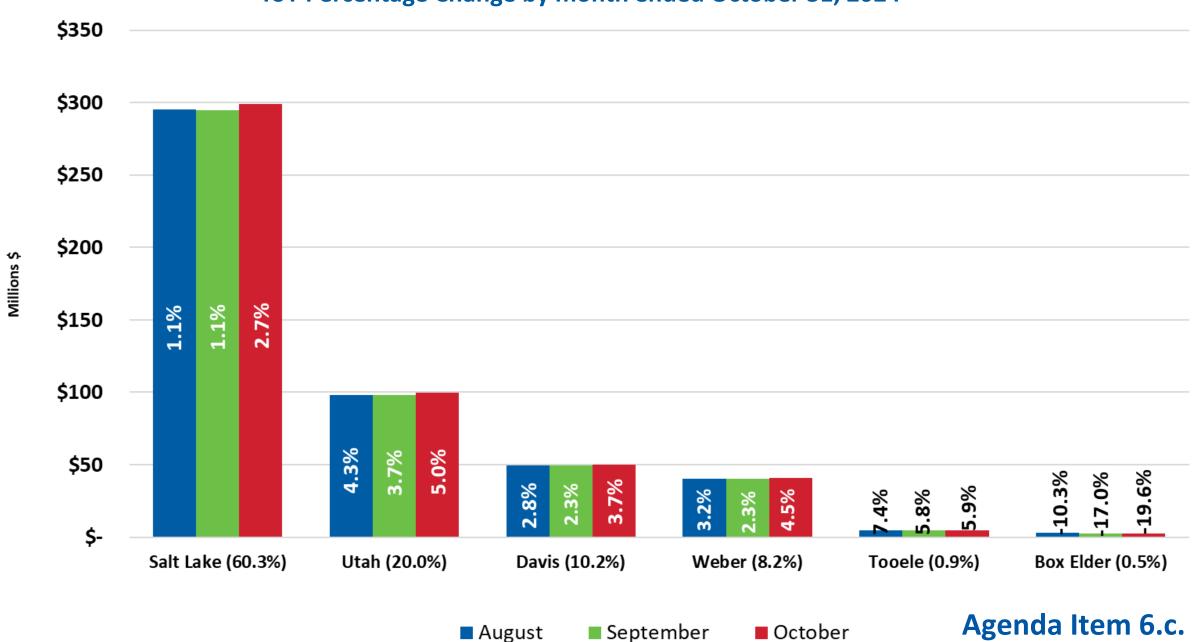

October YTD Variance \$5.8M / 1.4% Above Budget

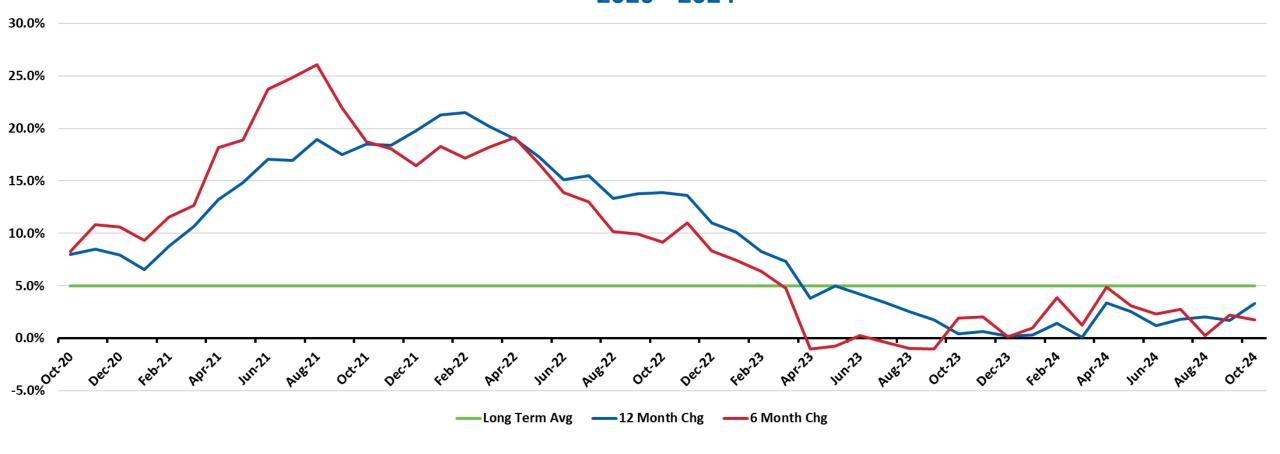

YoY Percentage Change by month ended October 31, 2024

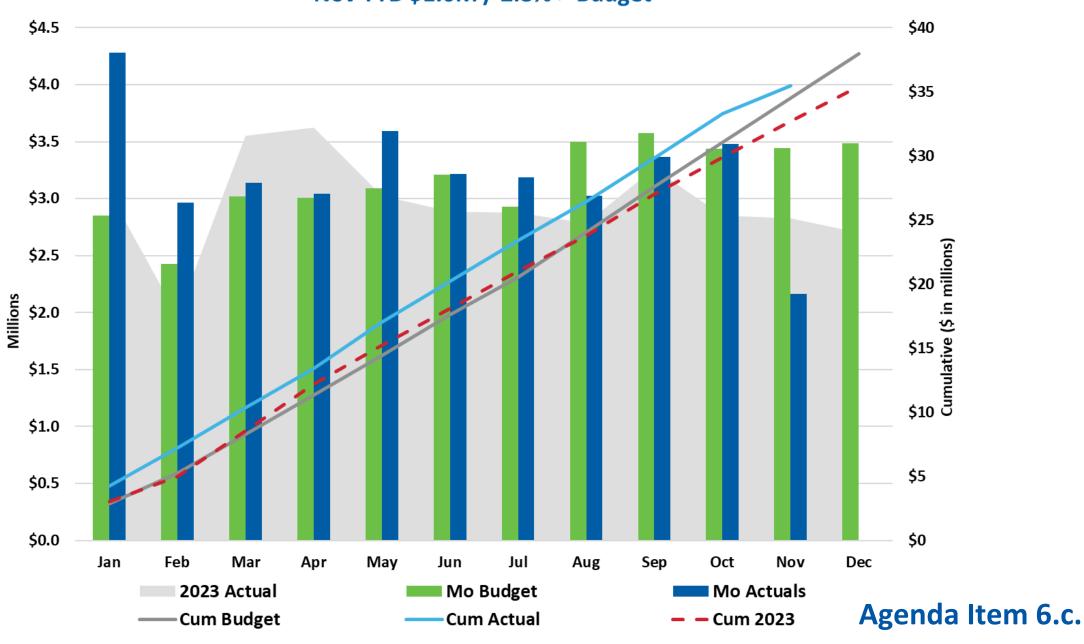


## UTA Sales Tax Growth 2020 - 2024

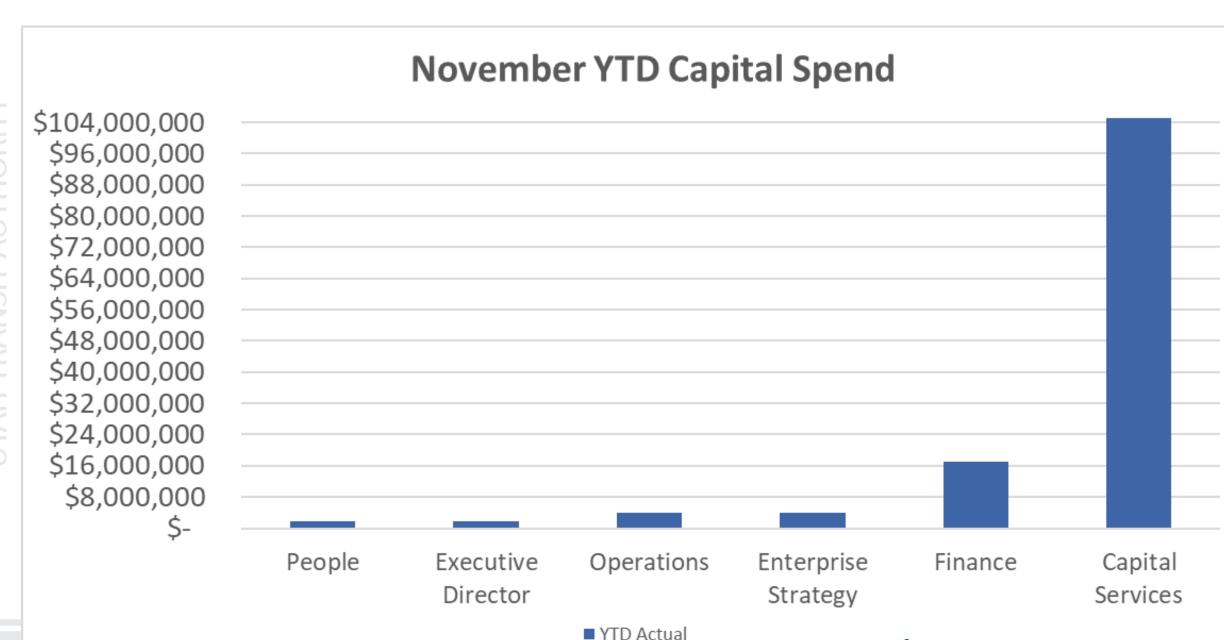
