


Sales Tax Collections

Key Bond Parameters and Terms

- Refunding Bonds, Series 2026: \$123 million, not to exceed
- Maximum Coupon Rate: 5.0%
- Maximum Length to Maturity: 7 years
- Price no less than 99%


Summary of Budget Requests

 - 3 projects, plus the Capital Contingency, will have budget decreases






Affected Project Overview

- FMA652 - Facilities Equipment Replacement
 - Projects to replace aging equipment across all UTA Business Units according to State of Good Repair criteria .
- FMA685 - Wheel Truing Machine- Jordan River Service Center
 - Procurement and installation of wheel truing machine to facilitate the rebuild of wheel truing machine at Midvale, and for preparation of new rail car delivery from Stadler.
- ICI235 - ERP System Replacement Phase 2: Procurement
 - UTA's financial system is in need of replacement. Project will support that effort. The near-term efforts include scope development for this large replacement effort.
- MSP207 - 3300/3500 South Bus Stop and Transit Signal Priority Optimization
 - Bus stop improvements along the 3300/3500 South corridor for ADA-compliance. Additional funding was received and utilized on the optimization of traffic signal priority for transit services.




Affected Project Overview - Continued

- MSP208 - Clearfield FrontRunner Trail
 - UTA is constructing a paved multi-use trail connecting the UTA Clearfield FrontRunner station to the Rio Grande Rail Trail and the Freeport Center. UTA has included 8' black-vinyl coated fencing along the rail side of the trail limiting access to the rail.
- MSP253 - MVX BRT
 - Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) from Murray Central Frontrunner/Light Rail Station to West Valley Central Light Rail Station. Includes 1.7 miles of exclusive bus lanes, a new bus hub at Salt Lake Community College, and connections to local trails.
- MSP286 - Utah County Park and Ride Lots (x2)
 - This project is to construct the infrastructure needed in Eagle Mountain (EM) City and Saratoga Springs (SS) City for the NEW bus service associated with Bus Route 860





- MSP320- TRAX Forward
 - Project to further scope development and identification of needs for projects needed to support the 2034 Olympics.



 - Replacement and modernization of rail switch machines and interlocking systems across UTA's light rail and commuter rail network, enhancing reliability, safety, and system performance while addressing equipment obsolescence and modernization.

 - This Includes bus sawtooths, bus circulation area, operator restrooms, wayfinding, bike parking, benches, bus shelters, utility, and site civil work including access. Bus charging and dedicated via rideshare parking is optional and maybe added depending on location.

Notable UTA Accomplishments in 2025

- Received the **Outstanding Public Transportation System Award from APTA**, the top award in the North American transit industry
- Added more than **1 million service miles** to the system
- Accelerated the **launch of the Midvalley Express (MVX) BRT route**, which will now open in spring 2026, one year ahead of when initially scheduled.
- Opened the **South Jordan Downtown Station** to accommodate rapid growth and serve as a direct access point to The Ballpark at America First Square
- Approved the purchase of **20 brand-new TRAX cars from Utah-based Stadler** — the first of their kind in the system



Notable UTA Accomplishments

- 2024–2025 winter season saw a **3% Ski Bus ridership increase** and exceeded **400,000 boardings**
- Opened the **BYU Central Campus Station**, a new **Utah Valley Express (UVX)** bus station to better serve BYU campus and the Provo community
- Awarded **\$41 million in federal funding** through two separate Federal Transit Administration grants to **upgrade the bus fleet**
- Recovered to nearly **100% of pre-pandemic bus ridership**
- Remains well **ahead of the national recovery average** for overall ridership






Ridership Recovery Since 2021

YTD Total Ridership by Year & Mode, Active Filters: All Service Type




Bus – Fastest Recovery

YTD Total Ridership by Year & Mode, Active Filters: All Service Type




Commuter Rail – Steady Climb

YTD Total Ridership by Year & Mode, Active Filters: All Service Type Commuter Rail




TRAX Light Rail – Post-SGR Bounce Back
